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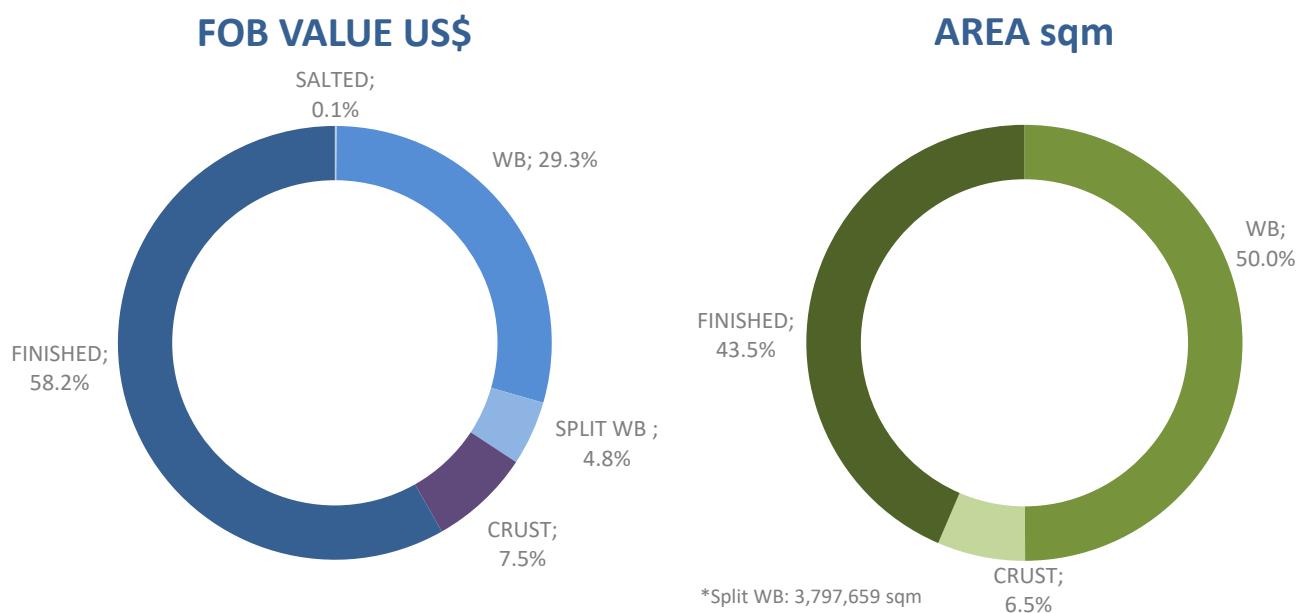
1 - ANALYSIS OF BRAZILIAN EXPORTS OF HIDES AND SKINS

MARCH 2019

The Hides and Skins Exports released by SECEX (Foreign Trade Secretariat), for the month of March 2019, registered the amount of US\$ 119.0 million, down 19.3% compared to the same month last year, when total exports were US\$ 147.5 million, however higher 7.3% compared to February, when amount was US\$ 110.9 million.

Considering exports in square meters, in march were shipped 18.2 million, 8.7% higher than March 2018, when total was 16.8 million. Considering the 1Q, exported area was 0.6% above 2018.

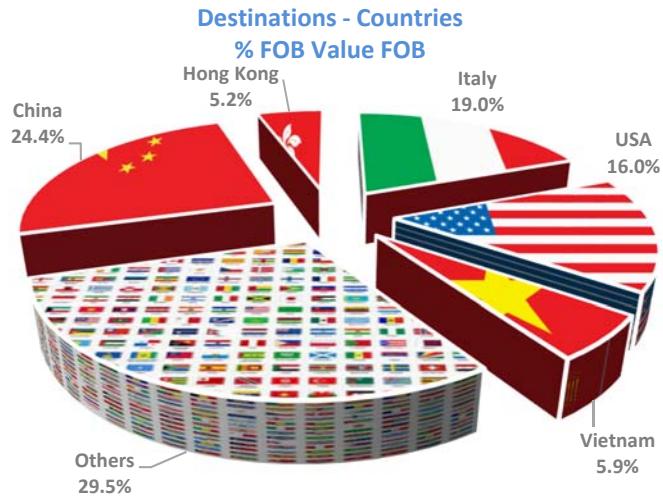
Profile of March 2019 exports is the following:



Considering types of leather, these are the variations of the Brazilian exports of bovine hides, in the period 2018 to 2019, in the first quarter:

- Salted with an increase of 61.6% in value and 35.5% in weight;
- Wet Blue with a reduction of 24.9% in value, but an increase of 19.4% in area;
- Split WB with a reduction of 4.9% in value and 10.6% in area;
- Crust lower 31,1% in value and 21.5% in area;
- Finished lower 21.9% in value and 7.2% in area.

Below are destinations for the first three months of 2019:



Below are some highlights of the quarterly results of some markets with relevant share in the exports of the sector:

- China, with share of 24.4%, had practically stable trade area, with small reduction of 0.2%, but higher decrease of 36.3% in value;
- Italy with share of 19.0%, grew by 5.5% in trade area, lower 7.7% considering value;
- USA with share of 16.0%, 10.3% reduction in area and 22.3% in value;

If we consider the other countries with relevant share and some of the target markets for the Brazilian Leather project, we highlight the growth of Hong Kong, with + 4.2% in value and + 61.3% in area, Germany with +40.8 % in value and + 75.5% in area, India with + 30.8% in value and + 93.7% in area, South Korea, with + 19.3% in value and + 83.9% in area and finally Spain, with + 28.0% in value, but a reduction of 18.7% in area, showing export growth with higher added value leather for this destination. Although still holding a small share of the total exported, France showed a significant accumulated growth in the first quarter, with + 647.5% in value and + 660.4% in area.

Below destinations of 1Q 2019:



Considering the exporting states, in monetary terms, in the period until March 2019, we have the following:

- Decrease in value among all major exporting states, with a negative highlight for São Paulo and Goiás, with 33.9% and 25.6%, respectively;

- Paraná had the lowest accumulated drop among those with the largest share, with only -2.9% in value;

- Rio Grande do Sul, now with a 25.5% stake, remains the largest exporter, increasing the distance to São Paulo, which has a 15.4% share;

- Paraná is approaching Goiás to take third place. Goiás still ranks third with 14.6%, but Paraná closed the third month of the year with a 13.8% share. At the same time, the fall of São Paulo is greater than that of Goiás, therefore also with the possibility of losing the second position;

- Two states started exporting in 2019: Amazonas, with 0.3% share, and Rondônia, with 0.1%. Tocantins and Piauí are the only ones that show growth, with + 119.4% and + 136.5%, respectively.

As a result, the first quarter of 2019 closed with a growth of 0.6% in the total area and a 22.7% reduction in value, clearly showing that the devaluation of product prices in recent years still has market effects. Volume growth occurred in the Salted (weight) and Wet Blue (area) stages, with reductions in Split WB, Crust and Finished, in these cases both in value and in area. Only the Salted hides had growth in value in the period.

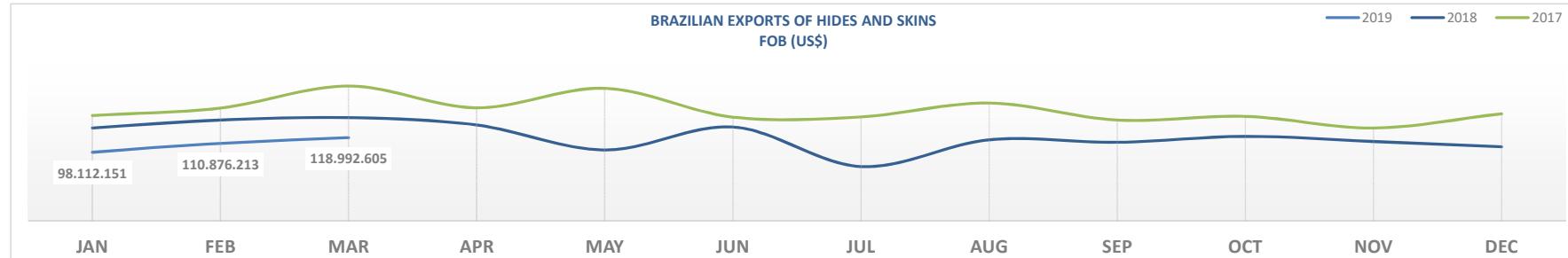
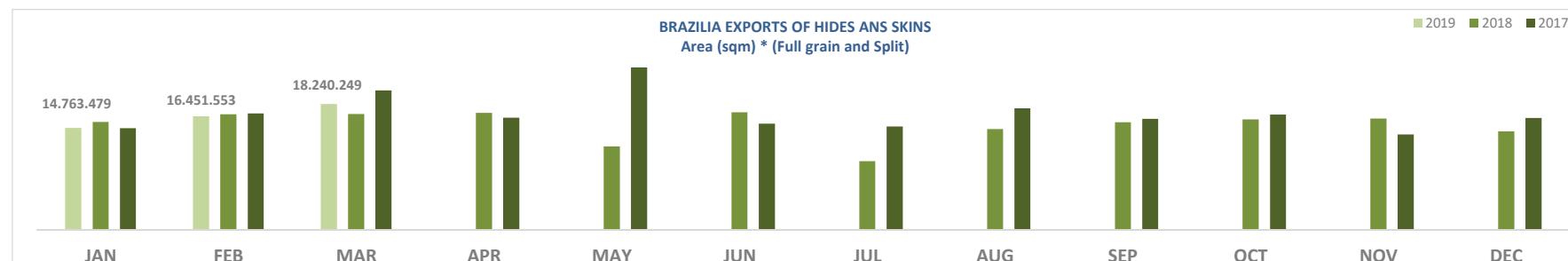
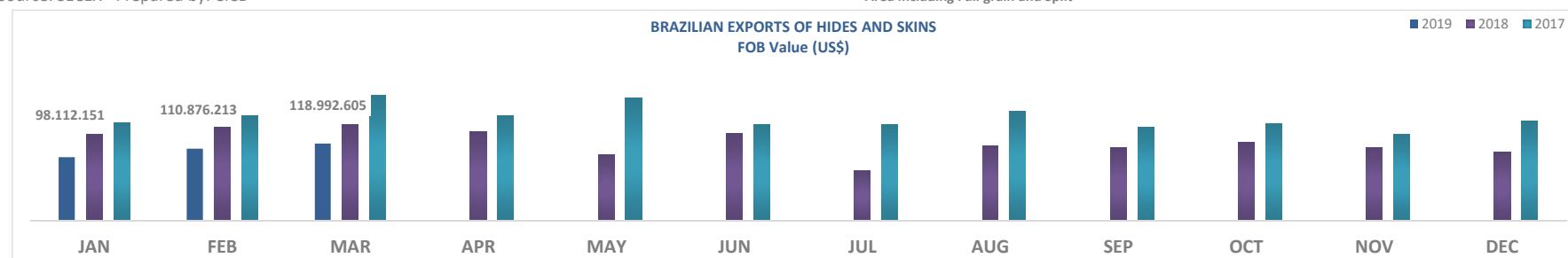
Rio Grande do Sul continues in the lead among the largest exporting states, followed by São Paulo and Goiás, but now with Paraná close to third place. With the state of Rio Grande do Sul increasing its share, it is clear that higher value-added products continue to be the best solution for maintaining markets and prices, in this state that has most of the production of leathers in the final stages.

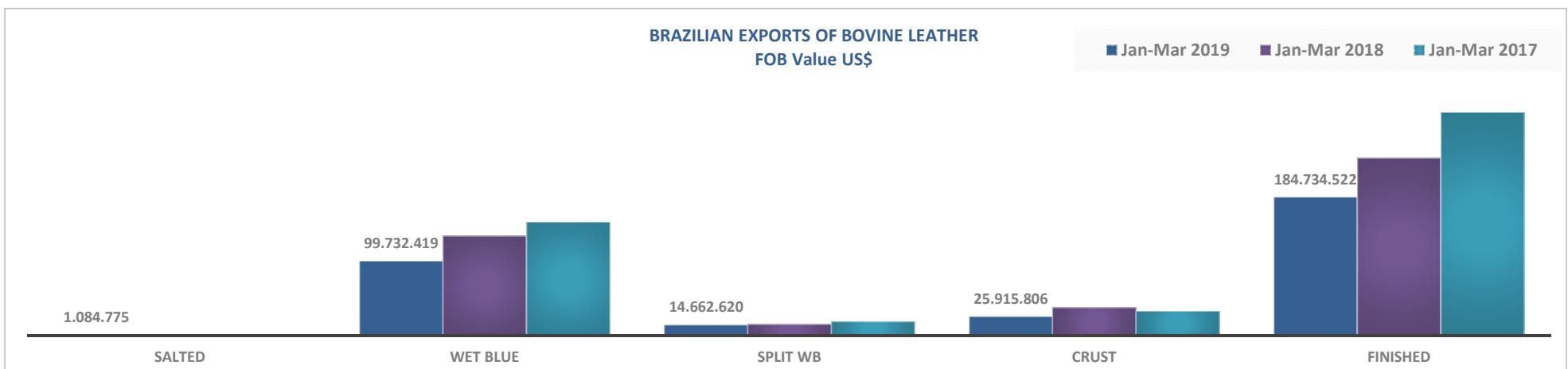
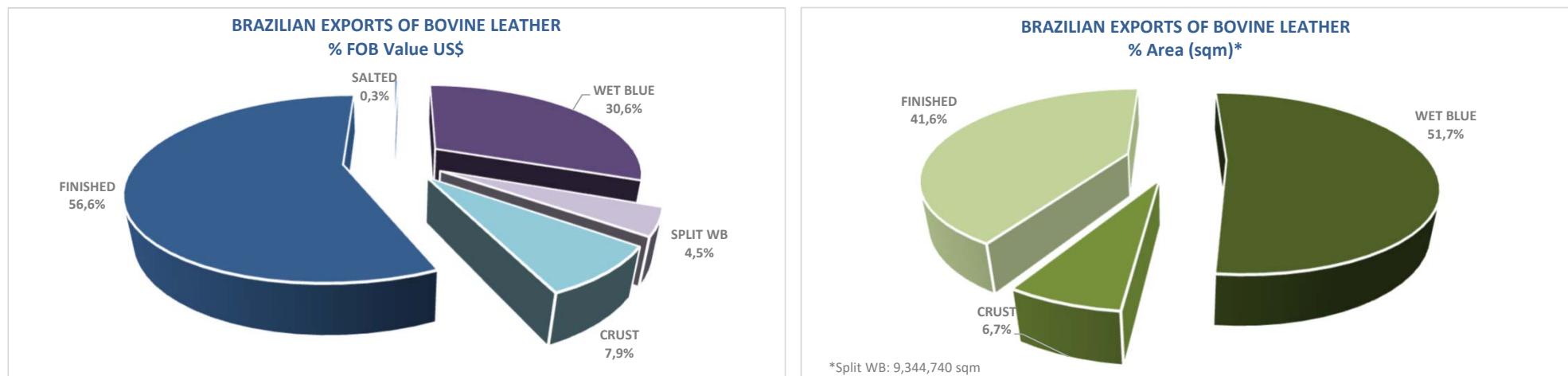
